## PBS

As part of our ongoing staff evaluation of the PBS program, we have reviewed our Student Behaviour Referral Process to ensure consistent communication with parents across all classes. Under this process, if a student continues a minor behaviour after being reminded and redirected, they will complete a reflection. This reflection includes identifying the behaviour and highlighting the expected behaviour. The incident will then be recorded, and an email will be sent home. The purpose of this communication is to keep you informed, and we appreciate your support in reinforcing these expectations at home. If you have any questions about this process, please contact your child's teacher.

## Student Behaviour Referral Process

Response is brief, calm and respectful

Staff will use low key responses as preventative strategies to support students in making appropriate behaviour choices throughout each part of the process and use restorative practice to maintain positive relationships with students.
